**Sam's confirmation**—Several Onslow Anglican parishioners went to St Peter's last Sunday to support Sam as he was confirmed. It was a wonderful service with a baptism and four confirmations. Congratulations Sam – we are very happy to have shared this special moment with you.

**An update on priests**—Esma is stepping down at the end of this month as our priest. Esma – thank you for all your ministry to us, we will miss you. You have become one of our Onslow Family. Esma's last services will be on 1 August. Details on a farewell for Esma's will come soon.

We are pleased to let you know that Rev. Rory Pilbrow will be coming to Onslow Anglican from 15 August to lead our worship for 6 months. This will be services only as it has been with Esma.

**Update from the nominators**—After prayerful consideration by vestry and nominators it has been decided to fulfil Peter's wish for his legacy to be used for 'general purposes' that this money be put towards the cost of a full-time vicar. It is a requirement of the Diocese that when appointing a new vicar this must be financially viable for three years – should we not be able to meet this cost from parish funds it will be underwritten by some parishioners.

We have not run a stewardship campaign for four years so ask that you continue to pray and ask God direction on what you contribute, both financially, and equally importantly in your time and talents.

To this end the nominators met with Bishop Justin last week to talk about the way forward. He was delighted to hear that there was a high level of commitment to moving forward and funding a vicar for three years to, hopefully, grow the parish and make it viable.

**Rosters**—The rosters for July and August are out. As mentioned last week there is still a real problem with the lack of people to fill roles. we are especially short of people to do morning tea after the 10am service –This does not have to involve home baking – a biscuit is fine – it is a time of fellowship.

Please consider if you are able to help with this role or indeed any other role – just contact Lee or the office.

**Outreach**—Outreach is a very important part of our ministry here at St Barnabas especially to those less fortunate than ourselves. Here are some ways you can help with this:

**Jammies in June and July**—In previous years you have been very generous with your donations – can we top last year's 24 pairs this year? They need flannelette pyjamas in sizes 1-16 or if you prefer thermals in same size range.

The last Sunday for donations is 18 July – there is a box in church near the pulpit for you to drop off your donation. We will then deliver them to the hospital. If you are not able to get to the shops but would like to donate just pop some money in an envelope clearly marked Jammies in June and Lee will go shopping for you.

**Social Supermarket**—Do not forget when you do your weekly supermarket shopping to add one or two extra items for the Social Supermarket. Just bring them along to church and pop in the basket at back of church. As we have mentioned before this new initiative of setting up a supermarket for people to 'shop' at has restored dignity and choice to people using this service.

**Get One Give One Campaign** - This campaign gives the opportunity for those in countries that cannot afford the vaccine the chance to be immunised. All you need to do is when you get your Covid-19 vaccine, give \$10 so that one of the world's most vulnerable can get theirs. \$50 covers a family of five and \$100 will cover two families. Please pass this information on to your friends, family, work colleagues – anyone who you think would like to be part of this.
