- There will be no morning tea after the 10am service.

All Saint's—It is with great pleasure and celebration we are able to let you know that All Saint's is sold.

The settlement went through last week. As we are sure you will understand at the moment it is not possible to give you a final amount for the sale as there are many adjustments to be made — the cost of the security surveillance, repairs to church etc have all to be calculated. These will come out of the parish share of the settlement. As soon as we have the figure, we will let you know. Sprucing up the entrance to the hall—The entrance to the hall has been cleaned and painted – it looks very smart. Thank you to Pam, our property person, for organising this. Break ins—There have been two break ins to the hall over the last couple of weeks. It appears that it is someone looking for some warmth and shelter. They have gained access through one of the lower windows in the hall and helped themselves to a hot drink and heating – fortunately they have not done any damage other than the broken window. These break ins were both on a Wednesday evening and the police were called. We have checked with neighbours who did not hear anything.

The glass has been replaced each time and we are looking into getting some security alarms around the church and hall.

Synod 2020—The Diocesan Council has decided to move the upcoming Synod to a virtual platform. Synod was to be held in Kāpiti Parish on the 19th of September but will now be held via Zoom online meeting on the same day.
