We continue to collect stamps (but not Kiwi stamps) and batteries at intervals (we will advise when to bring them to church). Spectacles that are no longer in use can be taken to Specsavers for recycling.

Through Wardens' Words, pew sheets and word of mouth we continue to encourage parishioners to use best practice by:

- Avoid using unnecessary plastic packaging /products
- Reusing, reusing and reusing where possible
- Recycling clothes and other items
- Repairing broken products to save them from landfill
- Choosing products made from recycled and recyclable content
- Disposing of items correctly
