Training Day is on 31 July at Samuel Marsden Collegiate School from 9.30am – 4pm. All are welcome.

There will be good coffee from the Diocesan coffee cart, lunch and so much more. It's a chance to catch up with old friends, make new ones and participate in a wonderful day of workshops, worship, and information sharing

The keynote speaker is Rev Bree Mills. Bree is a wife, mother, Anglican minister and a doctoral student in the area of Missional Leadership. Until the end of 2020, she was Senior Associate Minister at Glen Waverley Anglican Church in Melbourne where she pioneered a network of missional communities alongside a contemporary Anglican Church. She has completed a Masters of Missional Leadership, focusing on missional culture change in existing churches. Bree is passionate about spiritual formation, catalysing change, raising leaders, and contextualised mission.

'Lessen Our Carbon Footprint' – another initiative by the Diocese.

The next collective action for our Movement is to shrink our own carbon footprints (with God's help). The Advocacy team is running a Low Carbon Challenge – three months of prayerful action for our climate – which will run from August to November.

"This challenge is for everyone," said Advocacy Enabler Kate Day. "Your team could be two or more people from your household, church or workplace. It's for all ages and it'll be fun."

Your team will be able to join a briefing at Training Day (or watch later on video) and choose a goal that's relevant to your context. You'll then get support and encouragement from mentors and the option to attend inspiring events.

"The challenge is also a call to prayer," said Kate. "It runs in the leadup to global climate talks in November. Our actions to love the climate will be an offering to God while we also pray for action from our global leaders."

This challenge will also run through the Season of Creation (1 September – 4 October) – a global ecumenical season focused on care for the environment. The Advocacy Team is creating resources to help you mark this season in your context, including short videos, prayers and activities for children and youth. There are many ways we can reduce our carbon footprint – from buying locally sourced produce to walking, instead of driving, to the shops. It doesn't have to be complicated and big – many small changes can make a big difference.

So, what are you waiting for? Gather a team together and head along to Training Day to get inspired, set a goal (or goals!), get cracking, and have fun doing it. If you can't make it to the workshop at Training Day, a video will be available to get you and your team started. Your teams will get optional mentors and fun events to attend from August to November, but the only compulsory bit is attending the workshop OR watching the video.
