**Baptism**—Hamish Dempster, one of our 8am congregation, is being baptised at the 8am service on 22 August. Please pray for Hamish as he takes this step in his faith journey. There will be celebratory morning tea following the service – all are welcome to help celebrate this event.

**Diocesan news—*Training Day*** last Saturday was great – 5 of us from St Barnabas attended. The theme was mission and the day started with coffee (thanks Diocesan barristers, you did a great job) worship and a keynote talk from Bree Mills. Bree was unable to be there in person due to the closure of our bubble with Australia but joined via video link. This was great start to the day and followed by a variety of workshops including ones some more from Bree, children’s ministry, key team behaviours, a pre Synod regional meeting, the low carbon challenge launch, safety in ministry with adults, and other session on mission in all its forms. All this was interspersed with fellowship, fab food, and great weather.

**‘*Lessen Our Carbon Footprint*’** – As mentioned above the ‘Lessen Our Carbon Footprint’ initiative was launched Are you able to help by setting up a group here? Or just doing something yourself to follow this path? Bishop Justin said his family were going to cut down on their meat consumption and then immediately said he couldn’t believe he had said that! Will you join him in this? Maybe you can use public transport more or use less plastic packaging? there are many ways to do this. The challenge runs from August to November. It would be good for us to be able to be part of this challenge.

**Outreach reminders—*Outreach a very important part of our ministry here at St Barnabas especially to those less fortunate than ourselves. Here are some ways you can help with this:***

**Household goods for those without** - Flora is currently working at Kāinga Ora (Housing NZ) and a recent talk from one of the Tenancy Manager’s was a sad wakeup call for everyone on how little some people have. We all have excess household items in our houses – these can be put to good use for those who have little. We will organise a collection of good quality donated goods once Flora has a list from her colleagues so watch this space.

**Jammies for the Children’s Hospital**—Our jammies were delivered this week by Suselle, thank you Suselle for doing this. The final total was 35 – the hospital very grateful for our efforts here – well done everyone – some children will be toasty warm.

**Social Supermarket**—Have you been able to bring something for the social supermarket? Just a single can will make a difference here – maybe you could add a can or packet or two to your basket when you do your supermarket shopping. Bring them along and put in the basket at the back of church.

Food items that they regularly run short of include: *Breakfast spreads and cereal, Milk powder and sugar, Tinned soup, 2-minute noodles, Tinned tomatoes/pasta sauce, Pasta, Tinned fish/meat/vegetables, Biscuits, Muesli bars, Up & Go breakfast drinks, Laundry powder, toiletries and Baby wipes*

**Get One Give One Campaign** - This campaign gives the opportunity for those in countries that cannot afford the vaccine the chance to be immunised. All you need to do is when you get your Covid-19 vaccine, give \$10 so that one of the world’s most vulnerable can get theirs. \$50 covers a family of five and \$100 will cover two families. Please pass this information on to your friends, family, work colleagues – anyone who you think would like to be part of this.

**Recycling** - We are still collecting wine bottle tops, used pens, empty toothpaste tubes and old toothbrushes. The metal tops from jars are now able to be recycled as well so please add them to your collecting. There are boxes and a bucket at the back of church for these items. Please keep your old batteries at home for now – we will have another collection of these towards the end of August.

**Khandallah Village Market**—This will be held on Saturday 14 August in the Khandallah Presbyterian Church Hal from 10am – 2pm. A great chance to see local craftspeople, buy some presents and stock up on goodies.
